


#### **Kuhl Hose 2014 Annual Report**

# From the Fire Chief Don Erbin Jr. 680

The small "East Greene Community Organization" decided to start a Fire Company with 11 men in late 1949 with no equipment, no vehicles and no training. Kuhl Hose is celebrating 65 years of service to the community in 2014 with a dedicated group of citizens who give back to their community day and night. Out of 3 stations we operate 2 Engines, 2 Tenders, 2 BLS Ambulances and a mini pumper/brush unit.

Our roster includes men and women from many walks of life and experience including: Farmers, business men and women, fulltime health care providers, teachers, truck drivers and local home owners including young citizens. These men and women provide 24 hour fire, rescue and EMS service as well weekly training and community PR events. The fire service is not just about answering emergency responses. Their dedication to community is often only recognized by their families, and their fellow firefighters, who truly realize what today volunteer firefighters commit to do.

In 2014, Kuhl Hose was able to secure several grants that will benefit not only the Fire Department but the residents of the township.

- The EMS for Children Project through the PA Emergency Health Service Council awarded Pediatric Pulse Ox units to several BLS ambulance services in the Commonwealth. Kuhl Hose received 2 units. These units were made possible to improve our patient care to pediatric patients.
- 2013-2014 Pennsylvania Fire Grant of \$13,619.31 and an EMS grant of \$6,971.56. These Grants were allocated for equipment such as Radios, an Automatic Defibrillator, Hose, Rescue equipment and small hand tools.
- 2014 DCNR Volunteer Fire Assistance Grant which was a matching grant. Kuhl Hose received a 50/50 match grant. We were awarded \$7,176, which we have matched for \$14,352 to purchase equipment and install 14 dry hydrants across the township. These dry hydrants will be in addition to the 13 dry hydrants we already have. - Lastly, Kuhl Hose was awarded a very competitive Federal grant managed by FEMA and the Department of Homeland Security for fire departments and EMS agencies. We were awarded \$124,070 and with the fire departments match being \$6530 to make the entire program \$130,000. This will purchase 18 new SCOTT self-contained breathing apparatus (air cylinders, harness and face masks) as well as spare cylinders and an air filling station. Without this grant we would have had to finance or pursue other funding options for such a large purchase.





## From the President Chuck Will




Kuhl Hose Company has been offering fire and ambulance service to the residents of Greene Township for 65 years now. Much has changed over 65 years, in the way fire is fought, how prehospital emergency services are provided and how the businesses of a volunteer fire department are conducted. At Kuhl Hose, we raise our own funds to provide the most professional service possible. We are must while constantly changing to meet the needs of our community and meeting the state and federal standards for emergency services. We use the diversity of our membership to identify trends and construct long-range plans, manage budgets, oversee liability while managing and auditing a professionally run business. During 2014, we raised over \$250,000 by several means of fundraising (see the pie chart above). This is a lot of money to raise every year, but this is what it costs to keep our three fire stations and 7 pieces of apparatus ready to serve our neighbors any day of the year.


In 2015, we expect to rebuild one of our aging ambulances. Ambulance number 697, is 21 years old. Normal lifespan of an ambulance chassis is 15-20 years before it is recommended for replacement. We are expecting to replace this old chassis with a new one while mounting our existing ambulance box on the new chassis. The existing ambulance box is 100% aluminum and will likely last many more years. To rebuild this ambulance, it will cost Kuhl Hose around \$100,000.



2014 Fire Calls Map (89) (426) (430) Map dat Union City (6N)


### 2014 EMS Calls Map


